JOSEPH'S VILLAINS (cont) - Gen 37:18-33-

HIS BROTHERS' VIEW (18a)

HIS BROTHERS' VIEWPOINT (18b-20)

(A COMPASSIONATE COMPROMISE) And Reuben heard it, and he delivered him out of their hands; and said, Let us not kill him. ²² And Reuben said unto them, Shed no blood, but cast him into this pit that is in the wilderness, and lay no hand upon him; that he might rid him out of their hands, to deliver him to his father again.

REUBEN'S CONCEPT (PLAN) (21) And Reuben heard it, and he delivered him out of their hands; and said, Let us not kill him. REUBEN'S COMPROMISE (22abc) Shed no blood, but cast him into this pit that is in the wilderness, and lay no hand upon him;

REUBEN'S CAUSE (22d) that he might rid him out of their hands.

Gen 35:22

REUBEN'S COMMITMENT (22d) to deliver him to his father again.

REUBEN'S COURAGE (29-30) but before that, we need to look at

HIS BROTHER JUDAH'S VALOR (26-27) (A PRAGMATIC COMPROMISE) And Judah said unto his brethren, What profit is it if we slay our brother, and conceal his blood? ²⁷Come, and let us sell him to the Ishmeelites, and let not our hand be upon him; for he is our brother and our flesh. And his brethren were content.

HIS BROTHER REUBEN'S VALOR (Cont.) - A
COMPASSIONATE COMPROMISE (21-22)

REUBEN'S <u>DISAPPOINTMENT IN HIS</u> <u>COMMITMENT</u> (29-30) And Reuben returned unto the pit; and, behold, Joseph was not in the pit; and he rent his clothes. ³⁰ And he returned unto his brethren, and said, The child is not; and I, whither shall I go?
