Barnabas – More Than Meets the Eye

I. Provision Provider

A. Acts 4:33-37

- 1. He was led by the Holy Spirit and he obeyed.
- 2. It was/is God's to begin with, if He asked us to give it we need to obey and give it.

B. Luke 6:38

- 1. He will provide where He guides.
- 2. You can't out give God.
- 3. It is better to give than receive.
- 4. This principle doesn't only apply to money.

II. Prophetic Perspective

A. Acts 9:26-28

- 1. He saw God's hand on Paul before anyone else did.
- 2. He took Paul under his wing.
- 3. He mentored molded and shaped Paul into the Godly man that he became.
- 4. He did this under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.
- 5. Is it possible that Saul's 1st missionary journey was initiated by Barnabas?
- 6. If Barnabas had not obeyed God and had not done as God had directed him, where would Paul have been and where would the church be today.

B. Acts 15:36-40

- 1. He also took John Mark under his wing and mentored him as well.
- 2. Though Barnabas didn't write a book in the Bible, he was an influence on authors who wrote about 1/3 of the New Testament.

III. Power of Presence.

A. Acts 11:19-22, 25-26

- 1. Ministry is best done in person.
- 2. This was the beginning of Saul's ministry.
 - a. Saul preached and Barabas supported and ministered both to Saul and to those in the church.
- 3. God used them both and the church grew exponentially.
 - a. God used them both greatly to grow the church at Antioch to the 2nd largest church of the time. Jerusalem was the largest.

B. Personal Application

- 1. Be God's hands and arms.
- 2. A shared sunset is twice the joy. A shared flat tire is half the work.
- 3. Sometimes all that is needed is just your presence.
